<b>Introduction</b>	<b>Habitat</b>	<b>Food Web</b>
<b>Tell about your animals.</b>          	<b>Describe the habitat, where your animals live in the habitat, and what other plants and animals will be found there.</b>          	<b>Combine information from your individual food webs and show the producer, consumer, decomposer, and sun relationships in the food web.</b>          
<b>Survival Strategies</b>	<b>Compare</b>	<b>Conservation</b>
<b>Describe how your animals get along in their habitat. What adaptations do they have to make them perfect for their niche? What would happen if there were too many or too few of any one animal?</b>          	<b>Compare your animal to other animals or to humans (size, speed, longevity, sensory acuity, food consumption, care of young, etc.)</b>          	<b>Find out about the health of your animals in their habitat. Compare populations over time. Compare risks over time. Give suggestions for how people can help.</b>
