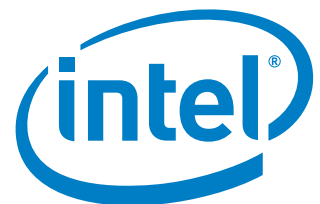
To take part in the Intel Teach Leadership Forum, the participant must:
