Dear Judge Farnan:


I respectfully request, on an expedited basis, that you execute the Request for International Judicial Assistance Pursuant to the Hague Convention of 18 March 1970 on the Taking of Evidence in Civil or Commercial Matters (the "Request"), as requested by AMD, which I have entered on this date.

In this regard, please be mindful of my outstanding request to the European Commission of March 30, 2009. (D.I. 1657). The European Commission has not yet provided answers to the questions raised and has advised that a coordinated and comprehensive reply will take some time. (D.I. 1711).

In the interest of reducing any attendant delay in my ultimate Report and Recommendation to you on the issue of whether materials, which the European Commission collected in the course of conducting its investigation of Intel, can be used in matters pending in this Court, the parties have agreed to the produce and hold procedure described in the last full paragraph of number 3 of the Request. (Transcript of April 17, 2009). I am satisfied that this procedure is permitted by the Hague Convention Article 3(i) and Article 9.

I stand ready to answer any questions that Your Honor may have in this regard.
